What is HPV?

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) is a group of viruses that:

- Causes warts (Non-cancerous tumors) and some types of cancer.
- Spreads through skin-to-skin contact.



95% of cervical cancer causes.

90% of genital warts.

HPV-Associated Cancers

Cancer Type	Percentage of Cases
Oropharyngeal cancers	60%
Anal cancers	90%
Vaginal cancers	78%
Vulvar cancers	25%
Penile cancers	50%
Cervical cancer & warts	Almost all cases





Key Facts about the HPV Vaccine

- Prevents more than **90% of HPV-related cancers** when given at the recommended ages.
 - HPV infections often clear on their own, but the vaccine provides critical prevention.
 - Safe, effective, and long-lasting.

Who Should Get the HPV Vaccine?



Girls and Boys Ages 9–26
Ages 9–14: Two-dose series.

Ages 9-14: Two-dose series.

Ages 15-26: Three-dose series

High-Risk Groups (Up to Age 45)

May also benefit from vaccination.

Why Vaccinate?

- HPV is Common: Can cause six types of cancer and warts.
- Prevention is Key: The vaccine can't treat HPV, but it can prevent infection.

Important Notes about the HPV Vaccine



Not recommended during pregnancy or breastfeeding.



Women aged 21-69 who received the vaccine should continue cervical cancer screening with Pap smear every 3-5 years.



Does not cause infertility or sterility.
